





Dedication of the Lee C. & Patricia Culler Boarding and Grooming Center.

On March 22nd, Patricia Culler and her daughter Stacy visited HHS to review the progress of the Boarding, Grooming and Travel Center construction.

This center is very unique to our campus and to the area as it is the first boarding, grooming and travel center in the nation for a non-profit animal shelter.

The pet-centric travel center allows travelers and local residents to take advantage of a grooming and boarding facility located right off I-95 and LPGA Blvd.

"When traveling with our 2 large breed dogs, it is always a challenge stopping at a rest area. They are scared of the highway traffic and they need to stay on leash for their own safety. This pet-centric facility allows travelers to use the rest area services and also gives them the opportunity to let their dogs use the fenced in and secure dog park" said Barry KuKes, Community Outreach Director of HHS.

The travel segment of the center includes a kiosk and personnel both that offer information regarding pet friendly hotels, restaurants, etc.

The center opened to the public on September 15th. A dedication ceremony will be conducted in honor of Lee Cunningham Culler who instilled the importance of giving back to the community that has always supported you to his wife and daughter.



Hurricane Irma

As the storm intensified outside, 15-staff members stayed with the animals to insure their safety and well-being.

On September 10th, 2017, a category 4 hurricane by the name of Irma was making landfall in Florida. HHS was at capacity due to taking transfer animals from smaller shelters and accepting an increased amount of owner surrenders. Some people could not evacuate with their pets, so they turned to HHS as a last resort.

A call was put out for Storm Troopers, disaster period foster parents who agree to take shelter animals into their homes until life returns to normal. Over 40 animals were placed with Storm Troopers and we are happy to report that over 25% of these animals have been adopted either by the foster family or friends/relatives of the foster family. One pup in particular, Prince was taken in by Jess Jenner. Jess was so impressed by Prince a butterscotch color lab/terrier mix, she went the extra mile to make sure he would be adopted after the storm. On September 18th, Prince was adopted by his forever home parents much in part the efforts of Jess. When told about his adoption, Jess wrote to us, "Excellent! I'm so happy. Thank you for all you do at HHS. If Hurricane Maria comes our way and I don't have to work, I'll come get another foster! Thank you for keeping me in the loop. You guys are amazing."

In additional to our fabulous Storm Trooper fosters, we also have an amazing staff. 15 staff members including our CEO, Animal Care Director, Veterinary Services Director and Community Outreach Director volunteered to stay at the shelter with the animals until the storm had passed. The animals were well cared for and kept safe from the storm. As the storm raged outside, staff and animals hunkered down and hoped for the best.

CEO, Miguel Abi-hassan addressed the staff at a luncheon sponsored by the HHS Board of Directors in appreciation of the staff efforts to care for the animals. "In all my years of experence working with an animal care facility, I have never been more proud of how our staff stepped up to the challenge and made the commitment to care for the animals during a major hurricane. I thank you from the bottom of my heart."

The staff at HHS is committed to caring for the animals in our care even through a major hurricane. Our Storm Trooper fosters, like our staff are ready to jump into action when the next storm comes our way.

An Interview with...

Patricia Culler and Stacy Cunningham Welch

Back in 1928, Ucal Cunningham closed his Gulf service station in Eustis, FL and moved to Daytona Beach, FL to establish a one-truck Gulf gasoline and fuel-oil distributorship. Four generations later, his great grand-daughter Stacy Cunningham Welch is the President and CEO of the thriving business that now offers air conditioning sales and servicing, fuel oil, propane, and much more.

Stacy's parents, Lee C. (Cunningham) and Patricia Culler have supported the Halifax Humane Society for over 20-years and now their names are featured on the newest addition to HHS, the Lee C. and Patricia Culler Boarding, Grooming and Travel Center.

Lee C. Culler passed away on April 9th, 2012. His wife, Patricia has continued to give back to the community with his wishes in mind to always give back to those who have supported you over the years. Patricia has been an animal lover since she was a young girl. She has been a member of the Halifax Humane Society board since the late 90's and served as board President from 1998-1999.

We had an opportunity to sit down with both Patricia and Stacy to talk about their lives, their business and their support of the Halifax Humane Society.

HHS- Patricia, I understand you prefer to be called Pat or Patty. May I call you Pat?

Pat- By all means.

HHS- Great, thank you. Pat tell us a little about yourself. Are you from this area originally?

Pat- Yes, I was born in Daytona Beach and lived here until I was 5-years old. The family moved to Palo Alto, CA at that time and we moved back to Daytona when I was 14. I graduated from Mainland High School.

HHS- Did you go on to college?

Pat- Yes, I attended Daytona State College and I was in the very first graduating class. Classes were held at the Princess Issena Hotel on the beachside of town. There were claw-foot bathtubs in many of the classrooms. It was quite the experience.

HHS- When and how did you meet your late husband Lee?



Pat- We met on a blind date. It was the day President Kennedy was assassinated and no one wanted to go out. A girlfriend convinced me to go with her on this blind date and that's when I met Lee. He was working with his Uncle Gary who owned Cunningham Oil. Gary had purchased the business from his father, Ucal Cunningham who was also the mayor of Daytona Beach in 1942. Lee was driving one of the fuel oil delivery trucks when we first met.

HHS- How long was it before you married Lee?

Pat- It was 9-months later, and it had nothing to do with Stacy (laughs). Stacy was born 9-years later.

HHS- Did you work for Cunningham Oil once you married?

Pat- No, I went to work for Florida Bank & Trust on Beach Street for a while. Then I went to Household Finance. GE came to town in 1963 and I accepted a position as an executive secretary in the Apollo Systems Department (responsible for the first man on the moon effort).


HHS- How long did you stay at GE?

Pat- Until 1970. GE was going through some reorganization at the time and my boss left the company. I was offered another position but it wasn't what I really wanted, so I resigned as well. There was this one time, Wernher von Braun the German, later American, the aerospace engineer and space architect credited with inventing the V-2 rocket for Nazi Germany and the Saturn V for the United States came to visit the GE facility. That was a big deal back then. I joined Cunningham Oil about a year later.

HHS- What did you do at Cunningham Oil? Pat- We had decided to purchase the business from Uncle Gary in 1969, so we owned it at the time I joined. It was heating oil didn't have much to do in the summer time. I did whatever was needed to be done. Then I had Stacy in 1973.

HHS- So, Stacy let's pick up with you from your high school days.

Stacy- I graduated from Seabreeze High School here in Daytona and then went to Lenoir Rhyne college in (Continued on page 25.)

Prison Pups N Pals

Class #41 Graduates

Last month, Halifax Humane Society celebrated the graduation of the 41st class of Prison Pups N Pals. Through August 2017, 217 dogs have completed the training program, which boasts a 100% adoption rate. In the Prison Pups N Pals program, Halifax Humane Society works alongside the inmates at the Tomoka Correctional Institute. Inmates learn dog obedience training techniques from our very own behavioral management team. The inmates are then able to take that knowledge and use it to train their selected dog.

The program serves a dual purpose that leads to positive futures for both the inmates and the dogs. The dogs receive obedience training that increases their adoptability and prepares them for life in a new forever home. Meanwhile, the inmates are educated on animal care and proper training methods, helping them gain skills that could lead them to jobs in animal services in the future.

While in the program, the dogs learn all basic commands, and some unique tricks as well. By the time each dog finishes the program, it is highly trained, obedient, housebroken, spayed/neutered, up-to-date on vaccinations, and micro-chipped. Prison Pups make great pets for any family, as their training eases the transition into a new home. After adopting a Prison Pup, new owners receive a free seven-week obedience-training program, further easing the transition to a new home.

Of the 217 Prison Pups, 22 completed a second month of training to be a part of the Paws of Freedom program. Paws of Freedom matches veterans with companion dogs. Last year, the Department of Veterans Affairs joined the existing Prison Pups N Pals program to create Paws of Freedom. Each class of Prison Pups now has two dogs selected to stay for an additional seven weeks of training in order to become a companion dog for a veteran. These dogs help owners that may be suffering from post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), providing them with emotional support.

Following adoption, veterans associated with Paws of Freedom receive additional financial support, a care package, and one year of pet health insurance to help



them with their new companion dog. According to Muni-Sathoff Paws of Freedom follows a collective body of research data that supports the overall benefit of companion dogs to the psychological and physiological health of individuals with whom they interact, especially their owners.

These dogs are carefully selected by our Animal Behavior Manager. Each dog will go through extensive training and stay by the side of their trainer and handler 24/7.

One of the graduates from class #41 was Bumpy, a Terrier Staffordshire mix that had been at HHS for 1-year. Bumpy was brought to HHS in terrible condition but our staff worked to rehabilitate him. After graduating from the program, Bumpy was adopted by a couple from Orlando and is now enjoying his new home.

PANS SUMMER CAMP 2017 a week of fun with the animals

Summer Camp 2017 was the best camp yet! Over 120 kids attended one week of the 6-week camp. (few attended twice!) The kids learned about all types of animals including bats, owls, sting rays, rats, ferrets, bunnies, cats and of course, dogs.

This years' camp included more hands-on experiences with animals and animal experts. The Daytona Police Department K-9 Division brought their police dogs for demonstrations and the kids loved these extremely well trained German Sheperds. My Angel with Paws service dog organization brought Gia and Tandum each week so the kids could learn about service animals and the services they provide.

Ms. Emily Dombrowski, our resident Behavioral Director, and Pat Mozden, President of the Obedience Club of Daytona, both demonstrated how to train dogs and how to respect a new dog's space so as not to upset the dog. The kids took turns giving the dogs commands and treats.



Prepare for Hurricane Season WITH AN EMERGENCY PLAN!

threat to Floridians, and for pet owners without an emergency plan in place, they can pose serious problems. Most recently Hurricane Irma descended upon Florida hitting our area as a Catagory 3. HHS sprung into action and 15 staff members including our CEO stayed with the animals the entire time of the hurricane. Each year, hurricane season runs from June 1 through November 30. However, we have learned in past years that tropical storms can form even outside of these dates.

A hurricane preparedness plan is important for residents of any coastal region, but humans are not the only ones that need to be prepared during inclement weather. Pet owners should have an emergency plan that accounts

for their animals as well, and should always be aware of the potential for evacuation in their area. A well-organized plan should help you and your pet make it safely through another hurricane season.

Pre-storm preparation is critical for you and your pet(s). If you wait until a storm is bearing down on your home, it may be too late. Create a checklist of pet supplies you will need. This should include leashes/collars, current ID tags and/or registered microchips, a three-day supply of food and water, medical records, ownership papers, a current photo, a crate, towels/blankets, and toys. Make sure to have these items on hand now, instead of waiting until a storm approaches. Remember that tens of thousands of people could be in the same situation, and stores often run out of items during emergencies.

If you are ordered to evacuate as a storm draws near, never leave your pets behind or turn them loose. Pets are domesticated animals that cannot survive on their own. Look for a friend or relative that will take you and your pet into



their home, or check online for pet friendly motels. Again, planning early will benefit you, since many other people will also be looking for places to stay. Most animal shelters, including Halifax Humane Society, do not board pets. In Volusia County, if you have no other place to go, you and your pets can go to the Deland Fairground People and Pets Shelter. Space is limited, so please make that your last resort.

When returning after a storm, keep pets on a leash until they readjust to their surroundings. Watch for downed power lines and other debris that pose dangers to you and your animals, and beware of standing water and other animals. Do not allow animals to consume food or water that may have become contaminated.

Stacy- Yes, but I worked with every technician and employee to learn and understand their skill set and responsibilities. I educated myself from the ground floor up.


HHS- Did your parents ever pressure you to come into the family business?

In addition to its use for adoption events, our adoption vehicle will also be used to transport groups of animals to be sterilized at the HHS Redinger Spay/Neuter Clinic. The Redinger Clinic is a state-of-the-art clinic that specializes specifically on pet sterilization at affordable rates. Since opening in 2012, the clinic has performed over 40,000 surgeries. By using the new vehicle to transport animals to the Redinger Clinic, HHS is able to reach new groups of pet owners that may have been unable to use its services otherwise. The vehicle was custom built using funds provided through a grant from The American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (ASPCA).
